Guidance Goodies

An important note regarding your child's academic progress. Most of the students work is completed through the Edgenuity online program. It is important to know that your child's performance is not only based on how well they do on the completed work, but also how much of the course work they get completed within a certain timeframe. Students must complete at least 70% of the coursework with a passing grade to receive credit in the course and the goal is completion within a 9 week time frame. At this point, your child should be finished with any courses they started at the beginning of the 1617 school year.
