

# **Annual Title I Parent Meeting**

## **Scott Lake Elementary**

#### **Slide 1**

Welcome to our Annual Title I Parent Meeting. I am Jackie Thomas and I am Scott Lake's Title I Parent Facilitator. We are so glad that you came and are looking forward to partnering with you this year in our adventures in learning. Our meeting tonight will be brief, but I wanted to highlight some Title I facts and the benefits Scott Lake receives as a Title I school.

#### **Slide 2**

Before we begin, please complete evaluation form when we are finished. This will be used as our record of your attendance, plus we are always looking for ways to improve and we value your input and suggestions. #### **Slide 3**

Title I is the largest federal assistance program for our nation's schools. The federal funds provide supplemental resources and services to schools with a high poverty rate, to schools that have migrant students and families, and/or to schools serving neglected and delinquent children and youth.

#### **Slide 4**

The federal funds are distributed to the state education agencies based on U.S. census poverty data. The state then sends money to school districts based on the number of families that receive free and reduced lunch or are a part of the direct certified community eligibility program. Finally, the districts identify eligible schools that are within their counties and distributes the funds to the local schools who qualify.

#### **Slide 5**

Title I's goal is to have schools and parents join forces to help students be more successful in school while giving parents a voice in their child's education. The program also provides tools and resources for families to help their students academically at home.

#### **Slide 6**

Of the funds that Scott Lake receives, a minimum of 1% of the school's funds is reserved for parent & family engagement as required by law. We spend these funds on student agendas so we have a daily means of home/school communication. All teachers use the agendas on a daily

basis to communicate with parents about school news, academics, and behavior, so it is a good practice to check them daily. The remaining funds are used for additional support staff, additional curriculum resources, technology, and/or library books. On a side note, we are still looking for books that have been marked as lost. At the beginning of the school year, we were missing about 1200 books. We are currently down to 917 books that are still missing. If you still have any of the school's library books at home, you can send them back with your child or drop them off in the front office. Thanks in advance! 😊

## **Slide 7**

Our district adopted curriculum that teachers use is Go Math, Reading Wonders, and STEMscopes for science. Supplemental materials such as Engage NY and Being a Writer for grades K-2 are also used to enhance the curriculum. If you have questions about the resources your students use, please contact your child's teachers and come out to our Curriculum Family Night on November 17th.

## **Slide 8**

The main assessments that Scott Lake uses to track the progress of our students is STAR Early Literacy, STAR Reading & STAR Math. This is given three times a year. Smarty Ants Reading is new this year for grades K-2 and Istation Reading will continue to be used for grades 3-5 as a more frequent monitoring piece. Freckle Math will be used as the more frequent monitoring piece for grades K-5. Students are considered proficient at the 50th percentile.

## **Slide 9**

4th and 5th grades will also have quarterly science assessments to monitor their science progress in preparation for the FSA Science Assessment. Proficiency for the science quarterlies is at 70%. And of course, end of year assessments include FSA Reading and Math for grades 3-5, and Science for grade 5. Students are considered proficient when they score a level 3. However, for grade 3 Reading, if a student scores a level 2, they will pass to 4th grade. For students that need additional academic assistance, teachers provide Tier 2 and Tier 3 services during small groups in reading, math, and science. For more information about Multi-tiered Systems of Support (MTSS), please speak with your child's teacher.

## **Slide 10**

For the 2018.2019 school year, Scott Lake maintained a grade of B. Here is a breakdown of the points earned. Each block is worth 100 points. When all the points from each section are added together, we earned a total of 380 points out of 700 which means that we earned 54% of the total points possible, equaling the grade of B. For the coming year, the state will use the 18.19 FSA test scores and the 20.21 FSA test scores to determine learning gains for 5<sup>th</sup> grade students and the school's overall grade. ## **Slides 11 & 12**

Each year, the district and the school creates a parent and family engagement plan that outlines the plans for engaging families throughout the school year. Parent input is also provided for both the district's plan and the school's plan assuring the end product is a joint effort in meeting the needs of our students and families.

## **Slide 13**

The Teacher, Parent, Student Compact is another document that is created with the input and suggestions of parents and families and outlines the expectations and responsibilities that the teachers, the parents, and the students have in the education process. This year's compacts can be found in your child's agenda. Please take a look at it and go over it with your child. You will also hear about this document during parent/teacher conferences.
